NOTEWORTHY FEATURES

Chronic fatigue syndrome	Revocation – 105 & 106 of 2021
	Replaces 11 & 12 of 2014

- The definition has been updated in format but SOP coverage is effectively unchanged.
- The RH factor for specified infections has one new addition. Giardia lamblia, which causes a diarrheal condition known as giardiasis, is now covered.
- The specified infections factor does not cover SARS-CoV 2 (COVID 19) infection. The SOP is not intended to cover "long COVID". Long COVID is a not yet well understood or characterised entity. It has a variety of manifestations, including chronic fatigue in

some subjects. It should be regarded for DVA claims purposes as covered by the Coronavirus disease 2019 SOP and as a separate entity to chronic fatigue syndrome at this point.

• There are new RH-only onset factors for: severe childhood abuse; category 1A; and category 1B stressors.

Fibromyalgia

Revocation - 107 & 108 of 2021

Replaces 13 & 14 of 2014

- Fibromyalgia is a disorder involving:
 - chronic widespread pain that is not accounted for by local pathology at the affected sites, and;
 - associated somatic symptoms, particularly moderate to severe persistent fatigue, sleep disturbances, or subjective cognitive disturbances.
- The SOP definition has been amended and slightly strengthened. There is a new requirement that pain be present in at least 4 of 5 specified regions.
- Being overweight has been added to the obesity factor.
- There are new RH-only onset factors for 1A stressors and for having a severe, chronic medical condition.
